In addition, he was Vice-Captain for the 2 previous seasons.

Tim holds numerous SLSA & Australian Professional Lifeguard qualifications & is regarded as one of the most experienced Lifesavers/Lifeguards nationally. As a competitor, Tim has an impressive record that includes :- British Iron Man Champion 1997, Coolangatta Gold (35-39 years) - 1st, 2nd & 3rd placings in 3 starts, NSW Masters Champion in Iron Man, Board & Rescue Tube, NSW & Australian Masters Champion with brother Michael in Board Rescue, & multiple NSW & Australian Masters medals with Team Jennett (Tim, Michael & Larry) in Board Relay competition. Tim has few peers as a fearless waterman who relishes a challenging board session in thumping surf off City Beach rocks or the North 'Gong bombie when it is `on`. Congratulations on your Life Membership of Wollongong City SLSC – an honour truly deserved.

Rest In Peace

Michael `Humbo` Humberstone , an amazingly independent & fiercely loyal man - passed away on 15 September, aged 50 years, following a courageous fight with cancer.

Humbo held a number of positions in WCSLSC during his 25 year service period with his contribution to IRB & Patrol operations the most prominent.

The memorial service to celebrate his life was the largest the Editor has ever attended & showed the true esteem he was held in from across a wide spectrum of the Illawarra - particularly Surf Lifesaving & Wollongong City Council.

Humbo was further honoured with a solemn eulogy & 1 minutes silence on the beach at Round 1 of both the Sydney Water Carnival (Warilla BP) & the Warilla Bowls Boats (Mollymook). The surfboat fraternity gave a final salute of all boats at sea with oars raised in respect – very moving spectacle & due recognition for his efforts in water safety & buoy laying expertise for both series over an extended period. Eulogy is on Notice Board.

In the words of the celebrant at Humbo's service, he was, to use the Australian vernacular, "**a bloody great bloke**". All who were fortunate enough to know him would agree. Condolences to his mother Pam, sister Carolyn & family.

Alan `Tex` Morton` - passed away in August. Swept Wollongong (City) crews for some years in the late 1960's before transferring to Fairy Meadow & continued his coach/sweep career. A real gentleman, he always maintained a keen interest in our Club especially the boat section. Condolences to his wife & family.

Les Hawkins – Life Member of both Bondi Icebergs & Bondi Surf Bathers Lifesavers Club & friend of many at Wollongong City, passed away in late September in his 80th year following a long & difficult period after suffering a stroke. 5 Wollongong City members attended the memorial service to celebrate his life & achievements - much appreciated by his family, officers & friends from both Bondi Clubs. ATV Concern – Safety First:

Not us, but another Illawarra club was reported for potentially dangerous operation (vehicle/public impact).

Summary of **SLSA Code of Conduct for ATV Operators:** (1) Act Responsibly + Care & Professionalism. (2) Promote Culture of Safety. (3) ATV is High Profile. (4) Understand Your Limitations. (5) Follow Operating Procedures.

Add WCSLSC Licenced/ inducted drivers only (must display P plates if applicable).

Walking speed only around people. Controlled speed in emergency response.

STOP-LOOK BOTH WAYS before crossing public footpath - be wary of walkers/prams /bikers/skaters/dog squad.

Remember – NSW road rules apply to ATV on beach (restricted conditions) including < 0.05 alcohol limit.

Accident/injury to self or public could lead to Police action & affect RMS licence - points deduction/fine/suspension.

WCC Dune Update:

City Beach - \$ approved for ongoing rubble investigations - in progress.

Monitoring dune profiles – ongoing (often see WCC surveyors on site).

Reduce dune height/re-profile – design in progress.

Remove vegetation/reshape from frontal zone – implement 2017-18.

New ATV:

The current ATV is to be replaced with funding originally provided through Clubs NSW Grants for a new IRB.

Looking at \$19,000 for machine that will handle the steep incline on City Beach & tow IRB up main walkway.

Have tested & short listed a petrol unit to replace the Diesel Cab Car.
